Sub: Conduct of Online Examination under Regulation 6 of Customs Brokers Regulations, 2018 by the National Academy of Customs, Indirect taxes and Narcotics (NACIN), Faridabad – Reg.

Attention of the Customs Brokers and all the members of the trade is invited to the communication received from National Academy of Customs, Indirect taxes and Narcotics (NACIN), Faridabad (Annexure I) for conduct of online examination under Regulation 6 of Customs Brokers Licensing Regulations, 2018. The written examination under regulation 6 for the year 2020 shall be conducted by NACIN, Faridabad on 06.03.2020 at the designated centres across the India. In this regard, advertisement has been published in leading newspapers on 28.08.2019.

The applications for the examination, complete in all respects, shall be submitted either in person or by Registered/Speed post in Form A (Annexure II) along with two passport size photos, self attested copies of Aadhar, PAN or other documents on citizenship, proof of educational qualifications, financial viability, mobile number, e-mail id and other requirements as listed out in ANNEXURE III along with the prescribed fee of Rs. 500/- (Rupees five hundred only) to the Commissioner of Customs, Custom House, Willingdon Island, Cochin – 682 009 from 14.10.2019 to 15.11.2019 up to 6:00 p.m. Incomplete applications and applications received prior to 14.10.2019 and after 6:00 p.m. on 16.11.2019 shall not be entertained.

The applicants are required to ensure the completeness of the application before its submission as no deficiency memo shall be issued and any incomplete application shall be summarily rejected.

The examination will be a Computer Based Examination with Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs), Questions will be bilingual i.e. in English and Hindi. It is informed that the time duration for the said examination which was earlier advertised as 3 hours has since been fixed as **two and half hours (10:30 hrs to 13:00 hrs)**

The pattern of the examination will be as follows:



The syllabus of examination is prescribed in regulation 6 (7) of the Customs Brokers Licensing Regulations, 2018, as amended. Those qualifying in the computer based examination will have to appear for oral examination in terms of Regulation 6, which will be held during the second quarter of the calendar year 2020. The pass percentage marks for qualifying in the oral examination will be 60%.

A dummy question paper for the purpose of awareness of the candidates will be made available on CBIC and NACIN websites www.cbic.gov.in and www.nacin.gov.in under the icon/tab <GSTP/CBLR EXAM> from February, 2020. A link to download the admit card will be provided therein. Admit card shall also be sent by e-mail to eligible applicants 15 days in advance before the examination. For convenience of the candidates, other necessary details like list of centres, guidelines to the candidates, help desk, e-mail id. etc will also be made available under the said icon/tab.



1. Undertaking on Stamp Paper of Rupees 500/- duly notarized in respect of the following:

- (a) he is a citizen of India;
- (b) he is a person of sound mind;
- (c) he is not adjudicated as insolvent;
- (d) he has not been penalised for any offence under the Act, the Central Excise Act, 1944 (1 of 1944), the Finance Act, 1994(32 of 1994), the Central Goods and Services Act, 2017 (12 of 2017) and Integrated Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 (13 of 2017);
- (g) he has neither been convicted by a competent court for an offence nor any criminal proceeding is pending against him in any court of law;
